Italy, Spain and Serbia, countries promoters. Turkey the first country in joining.

On November 12th, 2010, took place in Venice the constitution of the COMOF (Confederation of Mediterranean Orienteering Federations). The Notarial deed was signed by the countries that according to the requirements, were present: Italy, Spain and Serbia. A representative of Turkey was present but not being a signatory country by not having the documentation in rule.

1st COMOF GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING in Venice (Italy).

After the notarial signature, took place the First Assembly directed by Sergio Grifoni (President of the Italian Orienteering Federation). The Order of the Agenda included a new point with the acceptance of the incorporation of Turkey as a new country member.

The first point was the election of the COMOF President. Víctor García Berenguer (President of the Spanish Orienteering Federation), spoke to praise the work of impulse of the Confederation from Sergio Grifoni considering that he should be the First President of the COMOF due to the work already done, to what the present countries voted in favor.

After Sergio Grifoni's appointment (Italy) as President of the COMOF, the rest of the board of directors was constituted as follows: Víctor García Berenguer from Spain (Vice-president), Zorán Milovanovic from Serbia (Secretary), Jose Ángel Nieto Poblete from Spain (Council Member), Canor Odabasoglu from Turkey (Council Member).

The by-laws having been approved, the possibility of a first competition of the COMOF has been presented by Víctor García Berenguer as an offer to be developed in Spain in 2012.

The following point was to incorporate new countries and put on the table the importance to achieve the consolidation of the COMOF by attracting Federations from the three continents: Europe, Asia and Africa. The present countries distributed the responsibility of stimulating contacts leading to the development of the sport in the countries with little or no movement.

During the General Assembly of the COMOF, Mr Gianni Petrucci, President of the CONI (Italian National Olympic Committee), showed his interest and support.

The International Orienteering Federation officially recognized all the efforts made by the COMOF during the General Assembly celebrated in Trondheim on August 14, 2010. The proof of this recognition was the presence either in the constitution before Notary but also in the First Assembly of Maria Silvia Viti (Italy), Council Member of the IOF.

This recognition is due to the importance that the COMOF can have in the development of orienteering in the Mediterranean Area and its possible incorporation in the Mediterranean Games, which Games are recognized by the Olympic Committee.



International from 1952 and that would be an important step to enter Orienteering in the Olympic Games.

The development of Orienteering in the Mediterranean Area, would carry the introduction and later constitution of yet not existing federations and to there be represented countries of the three continents contributing to reach the number of 75 countries, which is one of the necessary premises to be able to have Orienteering in the Olympic Games.

The Italian Orienteering Federation (FISO) with its President Sergio Grifoni, took the initiative to give the first steps of the COMOF, inviting all the legal representatives of the considered countries of the Mediterranean Area, celebrating the first Act and Assembly in Venice, coinciding with the XXXI International Meeting Venice.

1st. COMOF COUNCIL MEETING in Belgrade (Serbia)

The 1st Council Meeting of the Mediterranean Orienteering Federations took place in Belgrade (Serbia) from 4th to 6th of March 2011.

The participating countries were: Italy, Spain, Serbia and Turkey as Members of the COMOF as well as Cyprus, Montenegro, Macedonia, Greece, Bosnia and Herzegovina as future Members. Guests: Romania and Bulgaria.

This first Council formally settled the first board of directors of the COMOF, represented by:

The Council was presided by the Vice-President of the IOF, Brian Porteus (Scotland). He has been presented the reports of the activities realized from the last meeting in Venice in November, 2010 until February, 2011.

During this Assembly, the Orienteering Spanish Federation proposed the standards regarding the Mediterranean Orienteering Championship development with a total of 12 articles and where the procedures of the competition would be ruled. The mentioned rules with some punctual modifications, were approved in their entirety. Likewise the organization of the Ist Orienteering Mediterranean Championship was initiated to take place in San Joan de Alicant (Spain) from 10th to 12th of February 2012.

The Assembly also approved the new logos of the Federation.



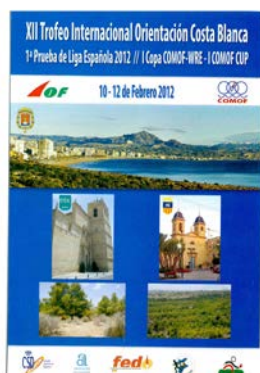

2nd COMOF COUNCIL MEETING in Chambéry (France).

On August 18th, 2011 and during the World Championships, the 2nd Council Meeting of the COMOF took place in Chambéry (France). During this meeting, the strategies continue being studied with a view to the consolidation of the Confederation by approving the entrance of two new countries: Montenegro and Macedonia.

At this time, 6 countries are members of the COMOF: Italy, Spain, Serbia, Turkey, Montenegro and Macedonia.

There, Spain presented to the Assembly the Bulletin N° 1 of the 1st COMOF CUP and Turkey set up its intention to organize a Congress in Istanbul in November 2012.

3rd. COUNCIL MEETING of the COMOF in San Joan d´Alacant (Spain).



On the occasion of the celebration of the 1st COMOF CUP, the Council Meeting of the COMOF took place on February 11th, 2012 in San Joan d'Alacant (Spain) as the 3rd COMOF Council Meeting.

During this meeting, the entrance of new countries is approved : Portugal and Cyprus, coming to eight (8) the number of countries members and having being accepted before in the I COMOF CUP participation.

The working guidelines were marked up to the Assembly to celebrate in July, 2012 in Lausanne during the 2012 WOC in Switzerland, and the possibilities were debated for the competition that would be named MCO "Mediterranean Orienteering Championships", to avoid confusions with other competitions.



The Council was presided by Sergio Grifoni, President of the COMOF, the Vice-President Víctor García Berenguer and the Vice-President Tatiana Kalenderoglu, and Maria Silvia Viti, IOF Council Member.

The working guidelines were also marked for the next years: the possible organizations and the diffusion of the COMOF information across a web page among other points. The actuality of the orienteering situation in the present countries was discussed and reached to a merger that was acknowledged by María Silvia Viti as the IOF representative.

4th. COUNCIL MEETING of the COMOF in Lausanne (Switzerland). 2nd COMOF GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING in Lausanne (Switzerland).

On July 16th, 2012, the 2nd COMOF General Assembly and the 4th COMOF Council meeting took place in Lausanne (Switzerland), during the WOC week.

The assessment and acknowledgement of the activities developed from the COMOF creation have been approved. The name of the COMOF Cup is modified to MCO (Mediterranean Championship in Orienteering) in order to avoid confusions with other sports movements realized previously.

There is no new country member to be included, unless the ones already been approved in the previous meeting that were Portugal, Macedonia, Montenegro and Cyprus. Even if France was attending the previous meeting, this country is expected to become a new member soon.

Turkey presents the first Bulletin of the IInd MCO to be organized in Antalya in 2013, which is approved. For 2014, the organization proposed by Portugal is accepted. Italy would be in 2015 and Serbia studies the possibility for 2016. Spain expresses its intention to work on it for 2017 which would coincide with the celebration in Tarragona of the Mediterranean Games and would be an important step. The possibilities are studied to encourage the countries to establish support strategies among their governments to give the officialdom of the sport in those Games. Likewise, the establishment of strategies for the development of the sport in the North African and Asian countries, without nothing of this would be viable, would give to Spain a great support.

The strategies establishment is defined in terms of dates and the strategic plan from 2012 to 2018 is approved.



5th. COMOF COUNCIL MEETING in Antalya (Turkey).

The 5th COMOF Council Meeting is hold in Antalya (Turkey) on Saturday 23rd of February 2013. Before this meeting, a preparatory meeting took place, that was presided by Sergio Grifoni (President of COMOF). The following persons were attending: Maria Silvia Viti, Council Member of the IOF (International Orienteering Federation), Zagorac Djordje (COMOF Council Member), Jose Ángel Nieto Poblete (COMOF Council Member) and Zoran Milovanovic (General COMOF Secretary).

The following persons atended the 5th Councill Meeting: Sergio Grifoni (President of the COMOF), Astrid Waaler Kaas (IOF Vice-President), María Silvia Viti (IOF Council Member), Tatiana Kalenderoglu (Vice President of the COMOF), Zagorac Djordje (COMOF Council Member), José Ángel Nieto Poblete (COMOF Council Member) and Zoran Milovanovic (COMOF General Secretary). An important representation of the Turkish Orienteering Federation (TOF) also attended, headed by its President Tekin Çolakoglu who introduced Dursun Katkat (The Director of the Department of 2013 Mersin's Ceremonies), as well as Thair Ayyash, Manager of Jordania, which showed with their presences their interest to become members of the COMOF.

During the meeting, the notification of the 4th Executive Commission celebrated in Lausanne (Switzerland) in July, 2012 was approved.

Israel was accepted as new member of the COMOF, presented by Jose Ángel Nieto as delegate.

Turkey exposed the works they realized in order for Orienteering to be exhibited in the Mersin'sMediterranean Games.

On the basis of Mr Zagorac Djordje's presentation, President of the Serbian Orienteering Federation, Serbia has been approved to organize the MCO for 2016. The candidacy is extended for 2015. For 2014, Portugal will organize it. The contacts established for Tarragona 2017 have been expos by the FEDO.

The works realized up to the date have been explained as well as the strategic directions for the period 2013-2018. The Councillor Jose Ángel Nieto presented a study of the current situation of the Games and the development possibilities: Israel's incorporation, the works that are being developed in Morocco through Jose Samper (Technical Director of the FEDO) and the programme for a short future among contacts and the company SUN – O. He also presented a general study of participation in the MCO of the Mediterranean Games where could be used as a base for a second analysis he also presented.

The IOF, with its Vice-President Astrid Waaler Kaas, confirmed its IOF support to the COMOF and offered to some identified countries seats for the Clinic in Finland during the World Championships.

For the first time, Israel was attending after there being accepted as member in the 5th Council meeting held in Turkey. Israel presented its official candidacy to organize the 4th MCO that would be carried out in conjunction with the Israeli Championships. It will be celebrated in Hevel Modiin (Oriental area of the country).

The opportunity of some Orienteering event in Italy was exposed, on the occasion of the organization of the Beach Mediterranean Games in Pescara.

Also the contacts established by Spain were exposed, to introduce the sport in The Lebanon, Palestine and Morocco.

The meeting followed the agenda, approving the minutes of the 6th Executive Commission celebrated in Vuokati (Finland) in July 2013.

The COMOF did not increase its number of member countries. The programme of the next meeting and General Assembly that will take place in Italy during the next WOC was settled. The dates for the presentation of the candidacies for the new Council were established. In the next Assembly, a new Board of Direction will have to born.

The accomplishment of negotiations was decided in order to try to be in the Beach Mediterranean Games, which will take place in Pescara in 2015.

Then began the programme guidelines for the next period 2014-2017. It has been asked to Spain the possibility of participating in the Mediterranean Games, to what Víctor García and Jose Ángel Nieto answered that this competition will not be able to be inside the JJMM. It will be posible to handle it within the Spanish League, WRE, MCO and before or later, but not inside, for not complying with the requirements linked to the organization of those Games and conversations supported with leaders of the Games. We have the need to continue working for the incorporation of countries coming from Africa and Asia. It was decided to propose to the countries that have not organized event, the possibility of doing it for 2017. In the case of a deficiency of application, Spain might organize it.

Israel and Serbia presented the next two editions that will be in 2015 in Israel and 2016 in Serbia.

Spain presented two projects regarding the introduction and development of orienteering, one in Morocco (Jose Samper) and other one in Lybia (Jose Ángel Nieto), projects where it makes clear that it is now the necessary time to implement and develop the sport, even if the future of the countries is uncertain.

During the days of the 7th Executive Commission of the COMOF, were celebrated the 3rd Orienteering Mediterranean Championships (the 3rd MCO) between Sâto and Aguiar da Beira, inside the Cup of Portugal, and valid for the Word Ranking Event with a great participation worldwide. Three trainings and Model Events, split in three days were organized.

8th. COUNCIL MEETING of the COMOF in Lavarone (Italy).

The 8th Council Meeting of the COMOF was opened on the 10th of July 2014 in Lavarone (Italy).

There was no incorporation as country member of the COMOF, being already nine countries, although France showed its interest and assured that it would be a member next year. Greece, Croatia and Slovenia showed equally their interests.

It was done a revision of the possible countries of Asia and Africa that are necessary for the federation, Morocco being named in several occasions by the role Spain is playing in this country. Other countries were named, but the political situation is not good. Egypt might be a quick new country member. The work in favour of the incorporation of other countries is going on in spite of all the existing problems.

The aim is to be in the next beach games in Pescara in 2015 as well as in the Mediterranean Games in Tarragona in 2017. It would be good to settle activities as consequences of these games, although it will not be possible to be trained or even be linked to them.

Then it appeared that the Olympic International Committee should be aware about our movement. Despite the documentation sent to them, they have not yet showed interest.

It is then urgent to continue working, illustrated by the report made by Israel about the participation in the 4th MCO.

During this Council, the incorporation of France was approved, reaching the number 10 in the COMOF member countries, as well as the next incorporation of Egypt linked to its incorporation to the IOF as number 79 in the member countries and the work developed in this country by the General Secretary of the COMOF, Zoran Milovanovic.

Lines were planned to continue working in Asia and Africa, despite difficulties and the electoral program for the elections of new Council members for the period 2015 to 2018.

During the days of 9th COMOF Council Meeting, the 4th Orienteering Mediterranean Championships (4th MCO) took place in Sarid, Zippori and Timrat, inside the OPEN of Israel, valid for the WRE and with great participation worldwide. In the competition we saw a great implication of Israel's clubs. As far as the institutional level was concerned, and during the closing ceremony attended D. Michael Moro from the Second Headquarters of the Embassy of Spain in Israel.

10th. COUNCIL MEETING of the COMOF and General Extraordinary Assembly in Inverness (Scotland).

On the occasion of The World Championship, the 10th Council Meeting of the COMOF and the General Extraordinary Assembly were celebrated in Inverness (Scotland).

Continuing the approved procedure, the new Board of directors of the COMOF was chosen for the following period of four years, with:

For the next Meeting, a new Council member has to be approved.

Members approved the incorporation of Egypt as new country (11th country of the COMOF) and first from Africa, being a very important incorporation for the development in the area and being able to be used as a stimulus to the rest of countries.

The date of the next Council Meeting was modified. Initially intended to take place in Slovenia on the occasion of the SEEOC Meeting in February 20th, 2016, it will be passed to Luxor (Egypt) on the occasion of the International Orienteering Championship in this country, change proposed by Tamer Mehanna, President of the Egyptian Orienteering Federation arguing the possibility of organizing a meeting with members of African countries.

It was approved in this meeting to find time to see the possibility that the 6th MCO could be celebrated in Tarragona in 2017, expecting Jose Ángel Nieto to give a response to his management as soon as possible, and keeping this priority option to the Mediterranean Games to be developed during this year in Tarragona. Moreover, the opportunity is also opened to France and Italy for 2018.

It also has been insisted on the work of publishing information across the COMOF Web page which is www.comofed.org.

The members pointed out the need to organize good competitions and to be attentive to a good delivery of awards.

11th COMOF COUNCIL MEETING in Luxor (Egypt).

The 11th COMOF council meeting took place in Luxor, Egypt, as the Egyptian International Orienteering Championship took place there.

The COMOF council thanked Mr. Tamer Mehanna, the President of the Egyptian Orienteering Federation, for his outstanding and developed work in promoting orienteering in Egypt. In the same way, Mr. Mehanna expressed his gratitude to the COMOF council for accepting the invitation and for approving having the council meeting in Luxor. In addition, he also highlighted the importance of orienteering in Egypt, as it has become a growing new sport in the region. We had the pleasure to have among us Dr. Asharf Sobhy, Egyptian and Sport vice minister who appreciated what it has been done in the country. He highlighted the fact that orienteering has become very popular in Egypt for the last two years, and now, the country is hosting an international competition where there are going to be young local competitors and international ones from more than seventeen countries. He emphasized his support to the development of orienteering in the country.

The council approved the General Assembly Act that took part in Scotland as the WOC took place there. In the assembly, it was explained all the different attempts to get more countries involved. Some of them are Greece, Slovenia and Croatia. In addition, it was pointed out all the different efforts that Zoran Milovanovic has made in order to try to arrange a meeting with the General Secretary of the Mediterranean Games, but there is no an answer. The Mediterranean Games in 2021 will be in Oran, Argelia and we will work really hard to try to introduce orienteering in Argelia and towards this country to become part of the COMOF, as one of the first steps to become part of the Games in 2021.

The organization of the VI Championship that will take place in Antalya, Turkey, in 2017 and the applications of both France and Egypt for 2018 will be decided in the next council meeting that will take place in Serbia. Applications for 2019 will be opened as well.

It has been explained the need to develop a strategic plan that will have to be developed and extended until year 2025. It is contemplated the Tarragona Games in 2017 and Oran 2021. This strategic plan 2016-2025 will be presented in the next Council meeting in Serbia.

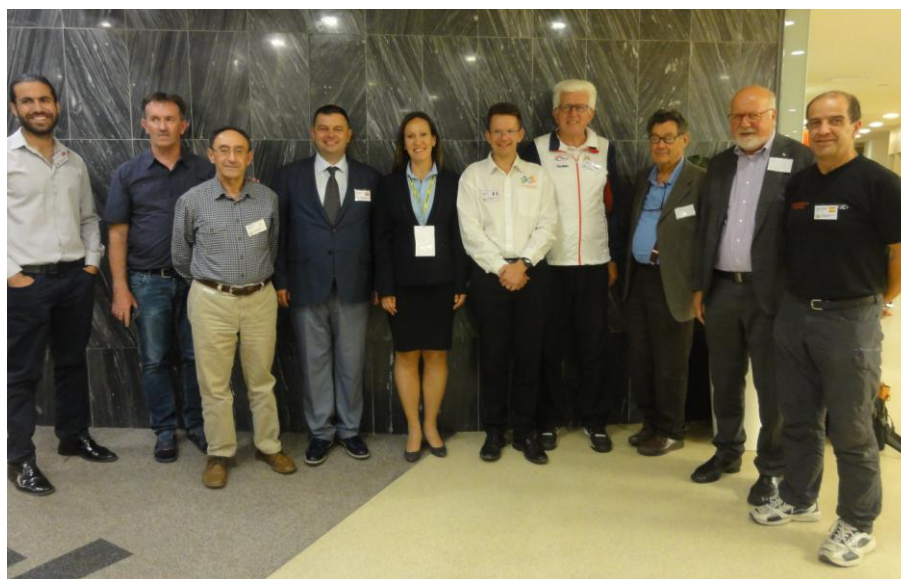
The status of the Memberships and the situation of the Countries was discussed, presenting the financial statement and with a view to the project 2018-2022.

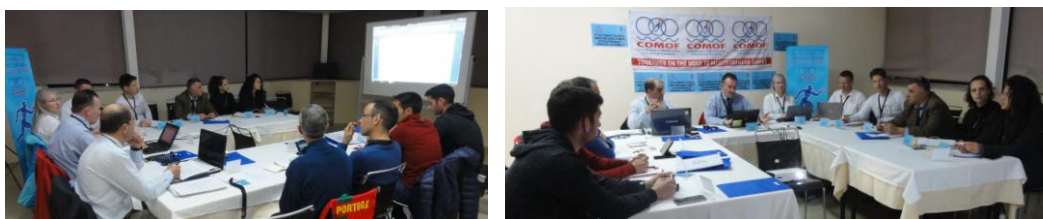

6th GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMOF (ON LINE)

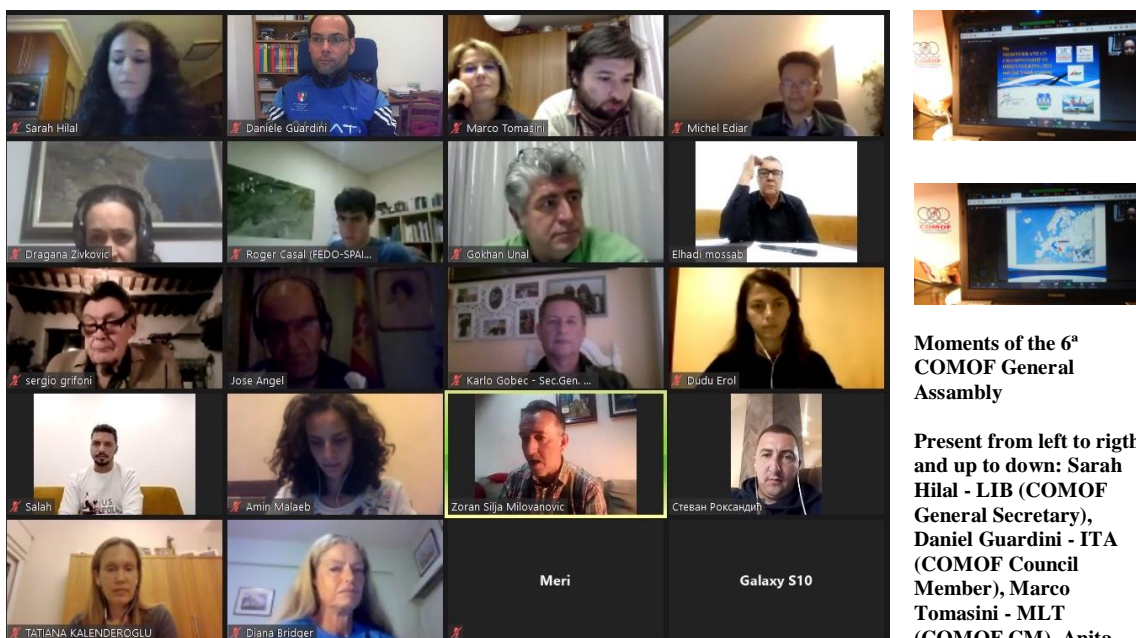
On November 12, 2020, the 6th COMOF General Assembly was held. This was Via ONLINE due to the health crisis.

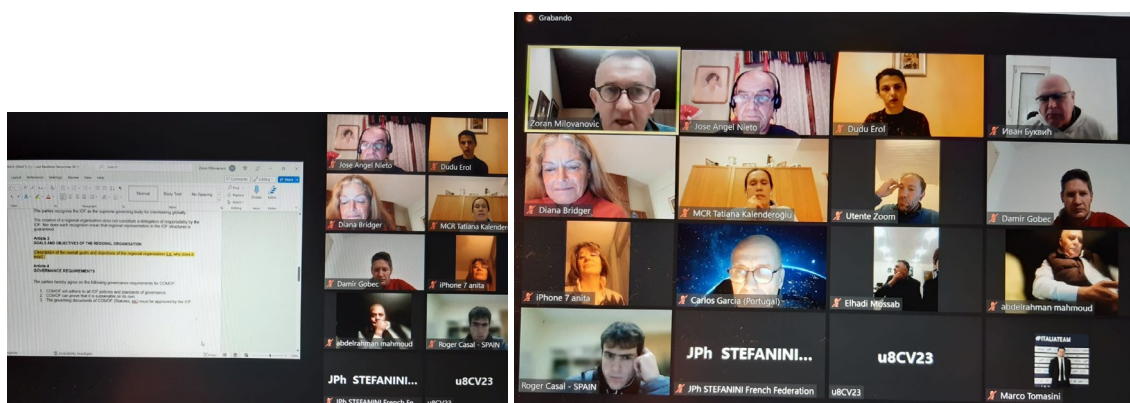
7th GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF COMOF (ONLINE)

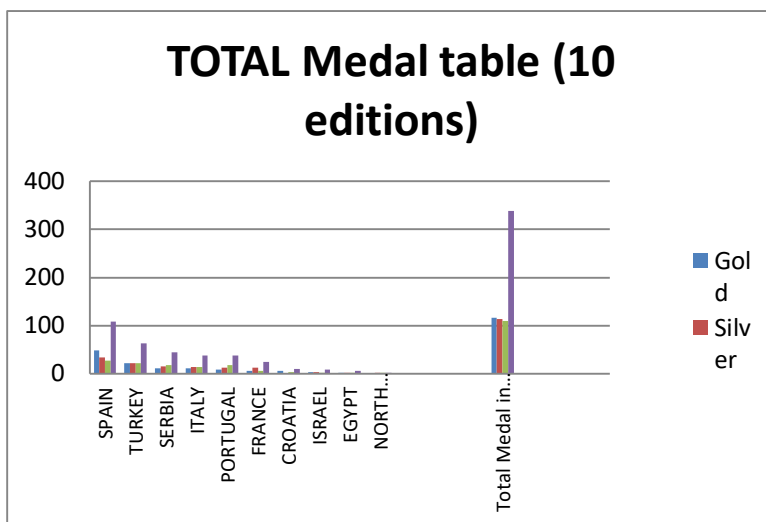
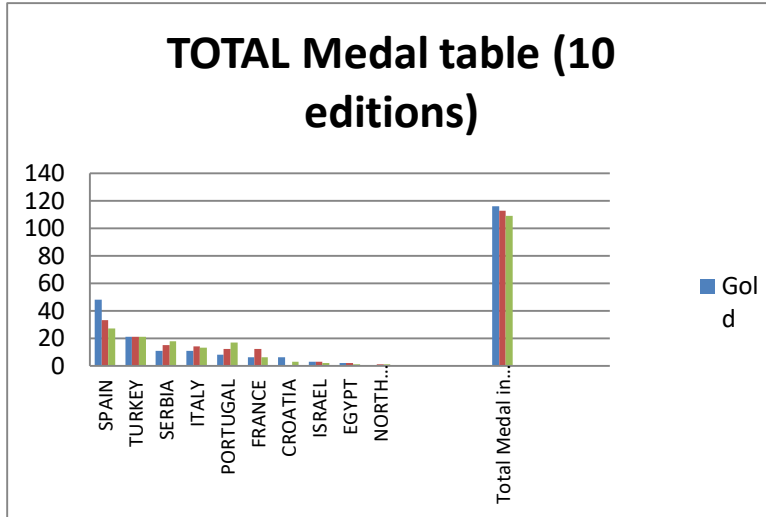


Total Athletes for Countries in MCO, relationship Man/Woman and participation Total (10 editions)

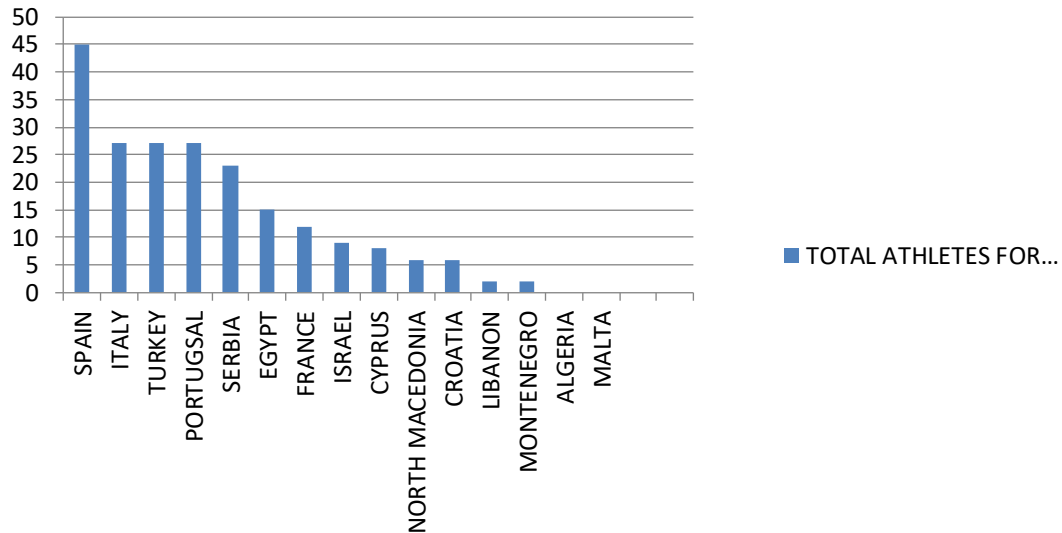

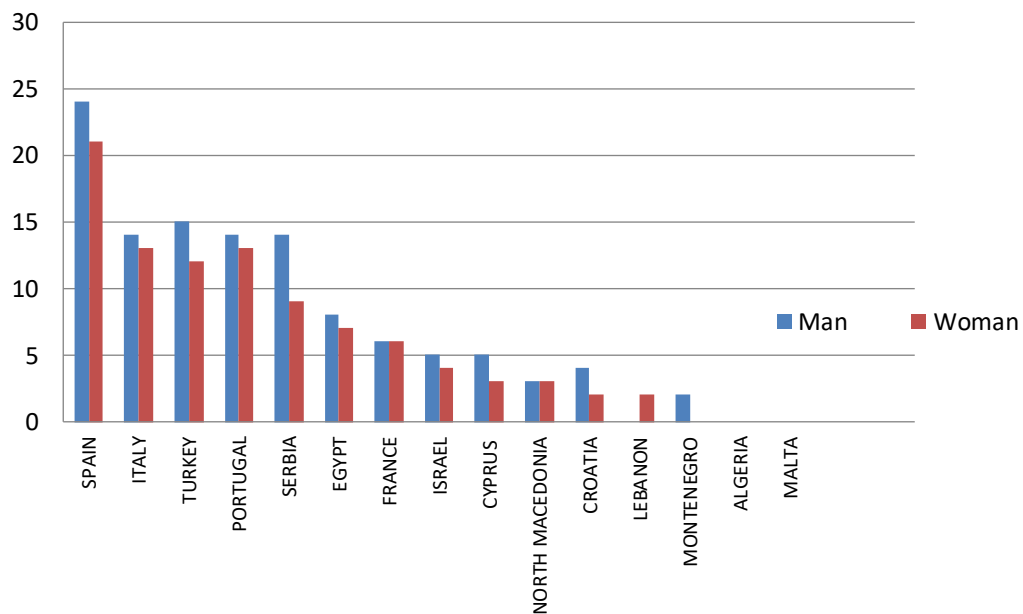




Total number of participating athletes by Country in 10 editions

Confederation of Mediterranean Orienteering Federations

Rules for Mediterranean Championships in Orienteering MCO

The Confederation for Mediterranean Orienteering Federations, referred to from now on as *COMOF*, in agreement with its statutes, Article 1 Point, decides to create the Mediterranean Championships in Orienteering, referred to from now on as *MCO* to be organized annually by one of its Member Federations and to be named Mediterranean Championships in Orienteering - MCO

ARTICLE 1

Any country of the Mediterranean Area can apply to take part in this event, submitted via its National Federation adhered to COMOF.

A representative Delegation from those countries of the Mediterranean region with no Orienteering Federation or where there is no significant development in sports could be invited in order to promote and develop the sport of Orienteering in that country.

ARTICLE 2

The objectives of these Championships are enclosed in the Article 1 of the COMOF Statutes:

- 1- to promote, organize and develop the sport of Orienteering in the Countries of the Confederation;
- 2- to promote the spirit of friendship and co-operation among the sporting people in the Countries of the Confederation;

- 3- to organize and promote new sporting events, apart from those already organized by the International Orienteering Federation (IOF), in order to establish friendly competitions among the countries of the Confederation;
- 4- to develop the principles of Orienteering with the patronage of the IOF, which is the only Organization entitled at international level to rule the Sport of Orienteering under the International Olympic Committee (IOC);
- 5- to organize, upon decision of the General Assembly, an event denominated "Mediterranean Championship in Orienteering – MCO" which will be assigned to an applicant belonging to the Associated Members by the Council according to the rules which will be issued by the Council itself;
- 6- to promote, introduce, update and improve the practice of Orienteering;
- 7- to promote scientific researches in connection with the sport in co-operation with Universities, Sporting Schools, the IOF and other National and International Institutions;
- 8- to work together to ban the use of doping in Sport;
- 9- to follow the policies of the IOC and CIJM
- 10- to encourage the policies of the IOF;
- 11- to promote the inclusion of the Sport of Orienteering in the Mediterranean Games.

ARTICLE 3

The Mediterranean Championships in Orienteering may be held at the same time together/parallel with another competition of the organizing country.

The competitions within MCO must have WRE status.

ARTICLE 4

The Mediterranean Championships in Orienteering will consist of a Middle Distance, Sprint Distance and Long Distance. In case if organizer does not have a suitable terrain for a Long distance, then Sprint Relay must be organized.

During the competition, a meeting of the COMOF members will be held. The COMOF President will lead the meeting and will propose the schedule and agenda. It would be very suitable if organizers would offer one room for free for each country represented at the meeting.

During each meeting, the organizing country could also offer the participants cultural or tourism activities.

ARTICLE 5

Each country at MCO will be represented by a team composed of four women and four men.

SENIOR (M/W 21 E) : 2 WOMEN and 2 MEN
JUNIOR (M/W 20) : 2 WOMEN and 2 MEN (According to IOF annual rules)

Checking the athletes' age is the responsibility of the organizing country, following COMOF criteria.

Participants must have citizenship of country they represent at MCO.

A country will be included in the classification when it has at least one runner in the event.

The start fees for the official COMOF national teams should be covered by the country organizing the MCO.

ARTICLE 6

Team classification will be calculated for all official National teams members of COMOF.

The points will be given according the following rules:

In each class for every distance, the points to be given will be 1 point for the 1st position, 3 points for the 2nd position, 5 points for the 3rd position, 6 points for the 4th position, 7 points for the 5th position, and so on.

A runner who is disqualified will receive points equal to the points of the last classified runner plus two. The country with no runners in this class will receive points equal to the points of the last classified runner plus four.

Example: 10 countries. The country «X» with a disqualified runner and the country «Y» without a runner:

1 ^o : 1 points	2 ^o : 3 points	3 ^o : 5 points	4 ^o : 6 points
5 ^o : 7 points	6 ^o : 8 points	7 ^o : 9 points	8 ^o : 10 points
9 ^o : 12 points (disqualified runner)	10 ^o : 14 points (no runners)		

The winner will be the country with fewer points in the general classification, adding the points of the four classes: MS, WS, MJ and WJ.

For Sprint Relay each country may have one 21 Elite Sprint Relay team and one junior team. Juniors may run in Elite team.

The winner team will get 10 points (with 2 teams country can score 10+10 points minimum).

2nd place 15points
3rd place 20 points
4th place 25 points
5th place 30 points
6th place 35 points

Disqualified team will receive points equal to the points of the last classified team plus 10 points. The country with no team in this class will receive points equal to the points of the last classified team plus 20 points.

In case of a draw, the classification will depend on the country that has obtained more:

- Number of winners among the four classes,
- Number of second positions or third positions, etc

ARTICLE 7

There will be trophies for first, second and third classified COMOF National teams, provided by organizers.

COMOF will provide for organizers special designed MCO medals for the 1st to 3rd classified in every distance (Middle, Long, sprint distance and Sprint Relay when applicable).

The COMOF will give Diplomas for the 1st to the 5th classified, for each class and distance.

Diplomas are the same type, specially designed by COMOF, and they must be produced/printed by organizer. Prize-giving will be after every competition or at the following day. The ceremony will be according to the programme of the organizer. National teams are obligatory to be present at the ceremonies.

ARTICLE 8

The following will be decided at the Council meetings of COMOF:

- * The organizer country in three years' time.
- * The dates of the competition in two years' time.
- * The type of distances which will be in used latest one year before MCO.

ARTICLE 9

The countries taking part in the event are responsible for their accommodation, living expenses, as well as transport costs. The organizing country will provide information about different means of accommodation and they will be included in the informative bulletins.

ARTICLE 10

The official language in the Championships will be the one established in the Article 4 of the COMOF statutes (English).

ARTICLE 11

Before the competition, a Team Official's meeting may be held, in order to welcome the participants and to report any important technical details about the event.

ARTICLE 12

All aspects of the technical details of the event not covered in these rules, it will be carried out according to IOF regulations.

COMOF STATUTES





CONFEDERATION of MEDITERRANEAN ORIENTEERING FEDERATIONS (COMOF)

STATUTE

Art. 1 –Denomination, Establishment and objectives

The Confederation of Mediterranean Orienteering Federations (COMOF) is an Association of National Federations which practice and promote the sport of Orienteering in the Countries of the Mediterranean Basin.

COMOF is a non-profit Association and has no political, racial or religious views. Its Code is based on democracy and the active practice of sport by men and women on equal opportunity basis.

The objectives of COMOF are:

- 1- to promote, organize and develop the sport of Orienteering in the Countries of the Association;
- 2- to promote the spirit of friendship and co-operation among the sporting people in the Countries of the Association;
- 3- to organize and promote new sporting events, apart from those already organized by the International Orienteering Federation (IOF), in order to establish friendly competitions among the Countries of the Association;
- 4- to develop the principles of Orienteering with the patronage of the IOF, which is the only Organization entitled at international level to rule the Sport of Orienteering under the International Olympic Committee (IOC);
- 5- to organize, upon decision of the General Assembly, an official event named **Mediterranean Championship in Orienteering (MCO)** which will be assigned to an applicant belonging to the Associated Members by the Council according to the current rules.
- 6- to promote, introduce, update and improve the practice of Orienteering;
- 7- to promote scientific researches connected with the sport in co-operation with Universities, Sporting Schools, the IOF and other National and International Institutions;
- 8- to work together to ban the use of doping in Sport;
- 9- to follow the policies of the IOC;
- 10- to encourage the policies of the IOF;
- 11- to promote the inclusion of the Sport of Orienteering in the Mediterranean Games.

In case of profit originating from the activity of the Association, it must be used only for sporting purposes. COMOF cannot distribute, directly or indirectly, any currency or capital unless it is a legal obligation.

Art. 2 – Duration

COMOF has a validity until 31/12/2060

Art. 3 – Headquarters

The legal, administrative and operative headquarters of COMOF is in Trento, Italy at the offices of the Italian Orienteering Federation (FISO), which will grant the hospitality and the functioning of the Council.

The headquarters can be transferred from one city to another in Italy upon a decision of the Council, or from one Country to another, upon a decision of the General Assembly.

Art. 4 – Official language

The official language is English. During all meetings of the Council and of the General Assembly English must be used. English version of all documents must be provided.

Art. 5 – The Member (Associated) Federations

The Countries who's Federations may belong to the Confederation are:

Any National Federation which is not part of the above list, but takes part at the Mediterranean Games may adhere to COMOF. The Council may invite or accept the request of other Federations to become COMOF member and to take part at the events organized by COMOF. The General Assembly may accept other National Federations which do not belong to the above list and do not take part in the Mediterranean Games to become Member Federations.

Art. 6 – Adhesion to COMOF

Once COMOF is established, the National Federations which wish to adhere to COMOF, will make formal request to the Council. The Council, according to Art. 5, will accept the adhesion, which will be ratified by the General Assembly at its next meeting. The General Assembly may propose to a Federation to become a member of the COMOF.

Art. 7 – Renunciation and exclusion from COMOF

The Associated National Federations could be excluded from COMOF for the following reasons:

- a- Renunciation;
- b- Expulsion

The renunciation must be communicated to the Council in writing.

The expulsion could be decided by the Council upon fault or lack to fulfil the directives of IOF, IOC or COMOF.

Art. 8 – The General Assembly

8.1 – Composition and Rights to vote

The General Assembly is the highest body of COMOF. It can decide any argument or minutes of the agenda. Each National Federation **present** has only one right to vote. Each National Federation may nominate two representatives to participate at the General Assembly. The President of COMOF participates at the General Assembly, but without a right to vote. The right to vote cannot be transferred.

8.2 – Decisions

The General Assembly will meet at least once every two years and decide about:

- a- the four-year period budget;
- b- the election of the President, the Vice Presidents, the Council members, by secret ballot;
- c- the election, on proposal of the Council, of honorary Presidents;
- d- changes to the Statute of the Association;
- e- the approval of budgets and annual reports prepared by the Council
- f- the organization of the MCO (Art. 1, point 5)
- g- the possible termination of COMOF;
- h- any other argument.

The proposal for any changes to the Statute of the Association must be addressed to the General Secretary at least three months before the Assembly. The proposal will be evaluated by the Council and presented to the General Assembly for approval or rejection.

8.3- Meetings

The General Assembly is convened and called by the President every two years by the Council who prepares the agenda. The call must contain the Agenda. The General Assembly may be convened by the Council if deemed necessary or upon request of at least one third of the associated members. When Orienteering will be admitted to the Mediterranean Games, in the year of the Games the General Assembly will be held in conjunction with them.

The notification must be made at least 60 days ahead of the meeting day with the agenda by means of electronic mail to the addresses provided by the members.

There will be a first and a second call.

During the first call the General Assembly will be valid if there is at least the presence of half of the number of members having right to vote plus one. During the second call, which will be at least one hour after the first call, the General Assembly is valid with any number of members.

The decisions will be ratified with a simple majority except for the changes to the Statute of the Association, where a majority of two-thirds is necessary.

In case of parity the vote will be repeated. If the parity persists the decision will be rejected.

Art. 9 – The Council

9.1- Establishment

The Council is made by a President, a Senior Vice President, another Vice President and two, three, four or five members, if the associated Federations are less than or five, at least six, seven or eight respectively, all with the right of one vote. The General Secretary will participate with no right of vote.

The Council may act with a minimum of three Members.

9.2- Power

The Council is the body which must direct the COMOF according to the guidelines and decisions taken by the General Assembly.

The Council will:

- a- implement the objectives of Art. 1;
- b- nominate the General Secretary upon the proposal of the President;
- c- convene the General Assembly;
- d- define the amount of membership fee;
- e- prepare budgets and balance sheets;
- f- prepare and approve the activity programs;
- g- approve rules and guidelines
- h- promote the implementation by the Members of the policy of IOF and of the Regional bodies;
- i- propose to the General Assembly Honorary Presidents;
- j- confirm urgent decisions taken by the President;
- k- invite or accept the participation of other Federations to the events organized by COMOF;
- l- discuss any other argument in the agenda.

9.3- Meetings

The Council will be called at least twice a year by the President by electronic mail, once to coincide with the MCO (Art. 1, point 5), if established, or with the Mediterranean Games, when Orienteering will be admitted to the Games, with one month's notice. The Member Federations have the responsibility to assure the presence of their Council Members and pay for their expenses.

9.4- Election

The Council will be in office for four years and will be elected in connection with the Mediterranean Games when Orienteering will be admitted to the Games. Members can be re-elected. Any Member Federation can candidate only one person to be elected in the Council in the position of President or Vice President, up to two persons for Council member position. Such candidates must not have been disqualified by their own Federation or by the IOF for more than 6 months total, nor must have been disqualified for the use of doping substances.

The General Assembly will elect by secret scrutiny first the President, then the Vice Presidents and then the other two to five Members. Should applications for President not exist, the President in charge will serve for another term of four years. Should applications for one or two Vice Presidents not exist, normal Council Members will be elected in place by the Council itself. Provided that applications exist, at least one Vice-President and two Council Members of each gender must be elected.

9.5- Forfeiture

The Members of the Council will lose their position after two consecutive unjustified absences at the meetings of the Council. The General Assembly may exclude a Member of the Council for indignity.

Art. 10 - The President

The President is the legal representative of COMOF. President can sign any contract or act on behalf of the COMOF. President will represent COMOF with the International Institutions. President will call the Council meetings and prepare the agenda of the meetings and call the General Assembly convened by the Council.

Art. 11 – Honorary Presidents

The General Assembly elects on the proposal of the Council Honorary Presidents of COMOF.

Art. 12 – The General Secretary

The General Secretary will:

- a- draw up the minutes of the General Assembly and of the Council;
- b- manage the office and be responsible of the correspondence and the books;
- c- keep the relations with the Member Federations and with the IOF;
- d- verify and keep the results of the MCO(Art. 1, point 5);
- e- release and provide relevant information to the Member Federations and to the Public;
- f- organize the list of International Judges and Event Advisers;

- g- be responsible for financial matters, effects and receives payments, manage the accounting, prepare the budgets and the balance sheets for the Council to be later approved by the General Assembly;
- h- carry out any other task assigned by the President or the Council;
- i- take part at the meetings of the Council and the General Assembly without a right of vote.

Art. 13 – Assets

The Assets of COMOF consists of:

- a- properties acquired or received from private or public institutions;
- b- donations or contributions of third parties;
- c- earnings from sponsorships or contracts;
- d- membership fees.
- e- sanction fees or entry fees from competitions;

Should COMOF be dissolved, the remaining assets will be devolved to the IOF.

Art. 15 – Last disposition

For any other argument not indicated in the Statute of the Association, the rules of IOF and IOC will be applied.

Statute confirmed at the COMOF General Assembly meeting held on 6th October 2018 in Prague, Czech Republic.

Dear President of the Orienteering Federation,

The General Assembly of the International Orienteering Federation, in its last meeting of August 14th 2010 in Trondheim, has decided to recognize the Confederation of the Mediterranean Orienteering Federations, once constituted.

It is needless to say the importance that such a Confederation would have for the practice and the development of our sport in the area of the Mediterranean Sea.

First of all, the Confederation will pursue the inclusion of Orienteering, at least in the Foot-O version, in the Mediterranean Games. This Games are recognized by the International Olympic Committee since 1952, and the inclusion of Orienteering will be an important step towards the ultimate goal to participate in the Olympic Games.

Secondly, the Confederation will be in the position to address the National Olympic Committees of those nations of the Mediterranean Sea which still do not practise Orienteering, offering support and advise to develop Orienteering and constitute their national Orienteering Federation. This again will be very important for the Olympic inclusion of our sport since a minimum of 75 National Federations is needed for this and such a goal is not yet reached.

Therefore, the Italian Orienteering Federation has taken the initiative to invite the Legal Representative of your Federation to the Deed of Partnership of the Confederation of the Mediterranean Federations, to be held in Venice on November 12th and 13th. It will be possible to participate in the International Orienteering Meeting on Sunday, November 14th.

The Italian Orienteering Federation is glad to offer to your Representative, which must have capacity to sign, hospitality for dinner and night on November 12th and dinner and night on November 13th 2010 and the entry in the Meeting.

The hotel will be the "Monaco" in Venice.

Since the proposal to constitute the Confederation was made by FISO, we are ready to take the engagement to initially host the offices and the secretariat, provided that the General Assembly will agree.

In order to prepare the Deed of Partnership it is necessary that you confirm the presence of your Representative in the shortest possible time, the name and title of the Representative, the exact name of your Federation, the seat of the Federation and where it is eventually legally constituted.

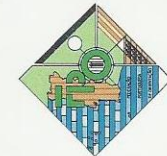

The Mediterranean Games is a multi-sport event organised by the International Committee of Mediterranean Games (CIJM). It is held every four years among athletes from countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea in Africa, Asia and Europe. The first Mediterranean Games were held in 1951 in Alexandria, Egypt, while the most recent games were held in 2022 in Oran, Algeria.

History

The idea was proposed at the 1948 Summer Olympics by Muhammed Taher Pasha, chairman of the Egyptian Olympic Committee and vice-president of the International Olympic Committee (I.O.C.), assisted by the Greek member of the I.O.C. Ioannis Ketseas. Separate Mediterranean sports events preceded the games. From 1947 to 1949, the Mediterranean Athletics Championships were contested, and the Mediterranean Cup football competition was held in 1949 and 1950. The first official Mediterranean Games were held in Egypt in 1951.

The Games were inaugurated in October 1951, in Alexandria, Egypt, in honour of Muhammed Taher Pasha, with contests being held in 13 sports along with the participation of 734 athletes from 10 countries. In 1955, in Barcelona, during the II Games, the set up was decided of a Supervisory and Controlling Body for the Games, a kind of Executive Committee. The decisions were finally materialized on 16 June 1961, and the said Body was named, upon a Greek notion, ICMG (International Committee for the Mediterranean Games). Twelve countries have hosted the Mediterranean Games: four from Africa: Egypt (1951), Tunisia (1967, 2001), Algeria (1975, 2022) and Morocco (1983); six from Europe: Spain (1955, 2005, 2018), Italy (1963, 1997, 2009), Turkey (1971, 2013), Yugoslavia (1979), Greece (1991) and France (1993) and two from Asia: Lebanon (1959) and Syria (1987).

The first 11 games always took place one year before the Summer Olympic Games. However, since 1993, they have been held the year after the Olympic Games. This transition means that the only time the Mediterranean Games were not held four years after the previous Games was in 1993, when Languedoc-Roussillon in France hosted the Games just two years after Athens. In 2018, the Med Games calendar was reset again when Tarragona hosted the Games in the mid-even year between the Summer Olympic Games (and the same year as the FIFA Men's World Cup).

The Mediterranean Games, in terms of the preparation and composition of the National Delegation, are held under the auspices of the International Olympic Committee and the Hellenic Olympic Committee (HOC). However, their establishment too must be credited to the HOC, for it held a leading part in their being founded despite all difficulties.

Athens is the permanent seat of the ICMG (regardless of who the President might be) and the committee's General Secretary is Greek. This comes as a further tribute to Greece, highlighting its leading role with regard to the function and strengthening of the institution. Except that Greece bailed out of its 2013 Mediterranean Games commitment when the two cities of Volos and Larissa were supposed to host the 2013 edition of the Games. But because of Greece's financial troubles, they had to give that up and the 2013 honors went instead to Turkey, with the city of Mersin rescuing the 2013 edition of the Games instead.

Participating countries

At present, 26 countries participate in the games:



- **Africa:** Algeria, Egypt, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia
- **Asia:** Lebanon, Syria and Turkey.
- **Europe:** Albania, Andorra, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Cyprus, France, Greece, Italy, Kosovo, Malta, Monaco, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Portugal, San Marino, Serbia, Slovenia and Spain

Kosovo was accepted as a member of the International Committee of Mediterranean Games in October 2015 and participated for the first time in the 2018 Mediterranean Games in Tarragona, Spain. One athlete representing the Vatican City participated in an unofficial ("non-scoring") manner in the women's half marathon event at the 2022 Mediterranean Games in Oran, Algeria.

Of all the National Olympic Committees within the Olympic Movement bordering the Mediterranean Sea, Israel and Palestine have not participated in the games, nor has Great Britain who represents the British Overseas Territory of Gibraltar and Akrotiri and Dhekelia.

In the case of Israel, Allen Guttman in *The Games Must Go On* argued that Israel's exclusion is both antisemitic and politically motivated due to antagonism towards Israel by the participating Arab nations. The IOC's Avery Brundage was not supportive of Israel's desire to compete, saying: "I cannot understand why anyone wants to go where he is not wanted". The International Amateur Athletics Federation pushed

the issue at the 1959 Mediterranean Games in Beirut by refusing to grant permission to hold an athletics competition unless Israel were allowed to compete. Lebanese games organizer Gabriel Gemayel conceded to this, but sidestepped the ruling by holding a parallel *Lebanese Games* comprising athletics events between the present nations alongside the official Mediterranean Games competitions.

There are countries not bordering the Mediterranean Sea which nonetheless participate: Portugal, Andorra, Kosovo, San Marino, Serbia and North Macedonia. Serbia, Kosovo and North Macedonia were all formerly part of Yugoslavia, which competed until its breakup and dissolution.

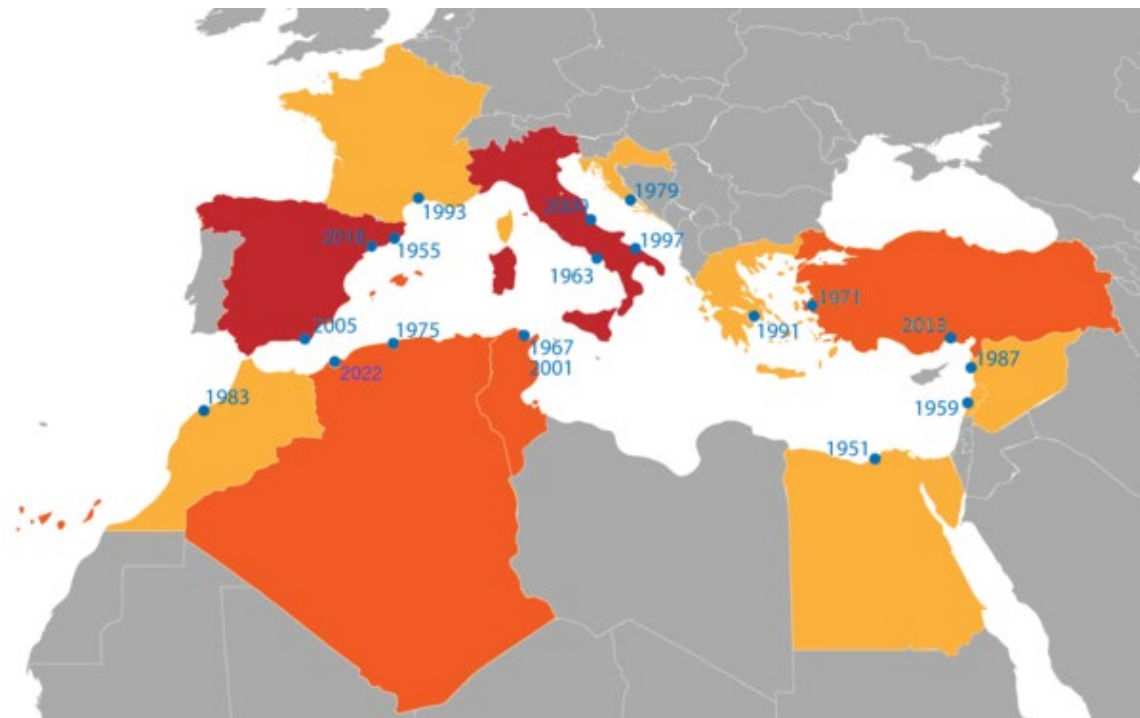
The Hellenic Olympic Committee has suggested that nine more countries that do not satisfy geographic criteria could be allowed to participate, such as Bulgaria, and some Arab countries such as Jordan and Iraq. Portugal competed in the 2018 Mediterranean Games after a decision which approved Portugal as effective National Olympic Committee.

Flag

The symbol of the Mediterranean Games consists of three rings representing Asia, Africa and Europe, the three continents involved in this competition. The rings dissolve in a wavy line in their lower part, as if they were immersed in the Mediterranean Sea. During the closing ceremony, the flag is transferred to the country of the city chosen to host the next Mediterranean Games.







Mediterranean Games

No inland city has ever hosted the games. All but one of the host cities to date have been situated on the Mediterranean coast (Casablanca is located on the Atlantic coast).


